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## J M WYATT STATEMENT

- I, JONATHAN MARTIN WYATT, make statement of truth knowing the consequences of inaccurate statements. I say as follows;-
  - 1. I worked for 28 years as a common law barrister and thereafter 13 years in arbitration. I am a Chartered Arbitrator. I have now retired.
  - 2. I live with my wife, Diana, at Little Manor, 1 Stoke Paddock Road, Stoke Bishop, Bristol BS9 2DJ. We have lived at this house since September 1987, nearly 29 years. This is located close to, but does not abut, Stoke Lodge Park.
  - 3. I have since living in the area used Stoke Lodge Park for recreation. Now that I am retired I regularly walk with others around the parkland, sometimes as much as six times a week. I generally enter by Cheyne Road. There are large logs situated on the park side and a post in the middle of the entrance to assist those entering and to prohibit vehicle entry. This has been the situation for some years. There are no notices there.
  - 4. The Park is used by many elderly people, some with disabilities, for recreation. It is a comparatively easy access. There are no steps. Those whose walking capacity is reduced or vision limited may still have good access. Although at this entrance wheelchair access would be difficult there are other entrances where it would be possible.
  - 5. During my walks I have seen frequent use of the Park by both organised and ad hoc sporting groups. When my nephew was younger he and I would often go to Stoke Lodge Park and have a football kickabout when he visited us. I recently enquired of a group of about a dozen youngsters aged 10 to 14 who were playing football using one of the sets of goalposts how often they used the Park. Their leader told me that they used it every weekend, rain or shine.
  - 6. I also recently spoke to the Secretary of the St Brendan's Old Boys Rugby Club who was holding a tournament in memory of Peter Pullin. He told me that they had over the past few years had some difficulty finding

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sports grounds to accommodate them as many of them were being sold off or closed. He indicated that Stoke Lodge Park was a saviour to them. The tournament was mini rugby for 350 youngsters.

- 7. I am aware that the scouts use Stoke Lodge Park to teach their youngsters field craft. I have spoken to the President of the local scouts about these matters and he has confirmed to me their regular use. It is a safe environment close to their homes.
- 8. I have also seen kite flying, picnicking and cricket playing taking place.
- 9. When we first came here the main gates that open onto Shirehampton Road were often left open. In more recent years they have always been kept shut unless the groundsman was present using his machinery. I believe the increased security was caused by the local authority's knowledge of the habit of gypsy travellers camping on playing fields when they were passing through the area. Although they have never occupied Stoke Lodge Park I believe it is a factor that weighs in the City Council's mind where their open spaces are concerned.
- 10.I have never met any staff of the local authority on the Park, though I have waived cheerfully to the groundsman who has been mowing the grass.
- 11. There are many dog walkers who enjoy the Park. My Nepali friend and I who often walk together have never seen any dog mess left by owners. These days they all seem equipped with pooper scoopers and plastic bags. Doubtless this is in consideration of the other local inhabitants' use of the Park.
- 12.I have visited Stoke Lodge both for elections and to use their facilities to hold an arbitration seminar for the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators Western Counties Branch. After determining taxing problems it was very good to be able to walk out into the green parkland and breathe the fresh air.

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- 13. Diana and I have in the autumn picked blackberries on the north eastern side of the Park. They grow in abundance and many local inhabitants are to be seen enjoying the fruit when it comes into season.
- 14. There are many trees of elegance and beauty in the Park and we have enjoyed a conducted tour of them by the Friends of Stoke Lodge.
- 15. Our house is close enough to hear the substantial activities that carry on in the Park with children shouting merrily as they play football and even some youngsters having occasional parties on the open land.
- 16.I recently received a message from George Ferguson, the Mayor of Bristol. In it he says, "Finally, let us celebrate our year as European Green Capital, which has given a great boost to the city locally and internationally". I entirely agree with him. Stoche (now Stoke Bishop) has been a village noted in the Doomsday Book of 1086. Now the village is a part of the City of Bristol. It is entirely appropriate that its local inhabitants should have their town/village green registered. Long live Bristol, the Green Capital, and Stoke Lodge Parkland, our Town/Village Green.



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
